What is it?

- An immersive film that can be played via the web or via a compatible headset.
- The 360 degree film is supported to be viewed in most web browsers, including: Google Chrome, Firefox, MS Edge.
- The film can be also be deployed inside of a head mount display. See Headsets page for how this is achievable.

Once you have downloaded the film you can save it to your device to be played back.


The following headsets are compatible with the immersive experience:

- HTC Vive




Sideloaded onto your device
